

#2 Concern in Strategic Planning Survey Road Maintenance

It was clear from the Strategic Plan Community Survey that ratepayers are very concerned about the roads in the RM. This concern ranked #2 after the #1 ranked concern *communication and transparency* which was addressed in the Sept. 17th Musings.

Knowledge is Power—Below is the *RM's Road Grading Map* showing the goal for how often roads are annually graded.

Grading and gravelling roads are not done in the winter when the roads are frozen. Our graders have snow wings to push snow away from the road edges to cut down on roads filling with snow when the wind comes up. During snow events, our operators will do their best to clear snow from main roads in a timely manner, so please be patient. 35% of the RM Budget is spent on road maintenance. Of about 500 kms of roads and road allowances in the RM, we maintain 375 kms to varying levels of service. This total does not include highways 20, 22, 220, and 322, as these are the responsibility of the Sask. Dept. of Highways.

One of the many financial challenges facing the RM of McKillop is the need to update our aging infrastructure and equipment. Because of depleted capital equipment reserves and a heavy debt load from the RM's 1.5 million share of the Lagoon project, funding equipment was not feasible in 2020. But after carefully assessing road maintenance requirements, and due to RM Council's prudent fiscal management, a new grader was purchased this year to replace an ageing problem grader. This was the first new grader purchased since 2011.

The RM's fleet includes 2 other graders, the newer of which was purchased in 2011 at a cost of \$278,000. Aside from regular maintenance, this grader required an engine rebuild in 2020 that cost the ratepayers \$57,000.

The oldest grader in the RM's fleet of 3 was purchased in 2008 for \$200,000. In 2018 this grader required a transmission replacement which cost ratepayers \$76,000.

Through strategic planning and sound budgetary management, RM Council and staff have developed a plan to rejuvenate and replace the graders in the fleet so that road maintenance can be accomplished in a safe and timely fashion.

DID YOU KNOW?

A set of 6 grader tires costs \$10,000 and up. A set of blades costs \$2,000 and last about 600-700 hrs of operating time.


Who are WE?
